The newer test kits also test for Influenza strains. Queensland Health no longer provides the free tests, so you will need to see your pharmacist about what test is best for you. In 2025, many test kits now offer multiplex testing—meaning one test can detect COVID-19, influenza, and RSV in a single swab.



Just a friendly reminder and with our hall looking so good let's try and preserve that fresh painted look for as long as we can. It seems to be so much lighter and even bigger – an optical illusion I know, but a good one.

## COOKS CORNER ..... Sticky Date Pudding with Caramel Sauce

#### **Ingredients:**

250 grams pitted dates - chopped 375 millilitres boiling water 1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda 125 grams unsalted butter - at room temperature, chopped 165 grams brown sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 2 eggs, at room temperature 300 grams - self raising flour, sifted Double cream to serve, if desired



250 grams caster sugar



#### **Method:**

- 1 Preheat oven to 180 C Fan Forced. Grease and line base of a 7cm deep, 22cm (base) round cake pan with baking paper
- 2 Combine dates and boiling water in a saucepan over medium heat and bring boil. Cook, uncovered, 5 minutes until dates are soft and have almost absorbed all the water. Remove from heat, stir in the bicarbonate of soda. Set aside for 20 minutes to cool
- 3 Using an electric mixer, beat the butter, sugar and vanilla extract until pale and creamy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Fold in the flour, then the date mixture. Spoon mixture into prepared pan.
- 4 Bake pudding for 40 45 minutes or until skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. Stand pudding in pan for 10 minutes, before turning out onto wire rack
- 5 For caramel sauce, pour the sugar into a clean dry non-stick frying pan over medium heat. Cook, stirring occasionally with a wooden spoon until the sugar melts and turns deep golden. Remove pan from the heat and pour in the cream (sugar will crystallise). Return pan to medium-high heat, cook stirring constantly for 8 minutes to dissolve the sugar. Boil gently, without stirring, for 5 minutes to thicken slightly.
- 6 Cut warm pudding and place on serving plates, pour over the sauce and serve with extra cream if desired.
