A big thank you to David Morgan for the time and trouble he has taken in applying for a grant, purchasing a new TV and getting the Starlink Connection organized at the hall on behalf of your Residents Committee, for all residents to enjoy. You will soon be able to appreciate the wonders of having a 'huge' TV screen in the hall with the ability to view live to air programmes such as State of Origin, Melbourne Cup, Christmas Carols in the Domain, Andre Rieu concerts, Bathurst Motor Racing etc as well as being able to view our movies of choice. It will also enable us to have video conferencing with other Hometown Villages with minimal delays in data transmission thanks to internet speeds of up to 220 Mpbs. The monthly charge of \$125 will be partially subsidised by Hometown the balance paid by Redbank Palms committees.

A free of charge check by QFES can help you identify fire and safety hazards. It takes about 45 minutes and can be booked by calling 13 7468 or by completing the online booking form. Book online at www.qfes.qld.gov.au Firefighters will advise you on correct positioning of smoke alarms and discuss fire safety concerns. The Queensland Firies from Camira and their big red truck are regular exhibitors at our Seniors Expo and always have heaps of information brochures available.



Scammers are getting more sophisticated, and their latest trick is to spread misinformation online. Recently, a series of social media posts have claimed that Age Pension recipients must submit updated personal, identity, or financial documents by a specific deadline. If recipients do not comply in time, Centrelink payments will be suspended or cancelled. Some of these warnings also claim that you could face fines or debt if you don't act fast.

Here are some red flags everyone should watch out for:

- Unsolicited messages: If you get an email, text, or social media message out of the blue, especially one that's urgent or threatening, be suspicious.
- Requests for personal info: Centrelink and Services Australia will never ask you to provide sensitive information via email, text, or unofficial websites.
- Strange web addresses: Always check the website address. Official government sites end in .gov.au.
- Poor spelling and grammar: Many scam messages are riddled with spelling and grammatical errors.
- Pressure to act quickly: Scammers want you to panic and act without thinking.

If Centrelink or Services Australia needs more information from you, they will contact you through their official channels via myGov or by a physical letter.

Extra Tips for Staying Safe ... - Never share your full credit card number, PIN, or passwords over the phone. - Be wary of unsolicited calls, even if they seem to know your details.- Regularly check your bank statements for unfamiliar transactions.- Use strong, unique passwords for your online accounts.- Consider setting up two-factor authentication where possible.

To ensure continued Rent Assistance you need to report the change in rent amount within 14 days through your Centrelink account linked to myGov, or by phone. Be prepared to submit the advice regarding rent increases, which our Village manager issues. Rent assistance is updated on the 20^{th of} March and September each year. Rent assistance is available for those paying rent in a private market (Residents here are eligible as we pay ground rent each fortnight in our Over 55's Village). Eligibility depends on receiving certain Centrelink benefits and meeting specific criteria. More details are available on the Services Australia website.

An alarming investigation by Animal Justice Party & Collective Fashion Justice has revealed that clothing containing *cat fur* is still being sold in Australia — despite supposed bans. Imported garments labelled as faux fur have been found to contain real fur from animals like raccoon, dogs and cats, sourced from cruel overseas fur farms. This shocking discovery exposes massive gaps in enforcement and regulation. It's time Australia took a real stand, and it starts with us being vigilant about what we buy. That cozy, pretty fur trimmed garment may well have come at the sacrifice of another living being. Money talks and voting with our pockets by refusing to purchase such items, speaks volumes.

National Australia Bank (NAB) recently trimmed the interest rate on its popular Reward Saver account, marking a double whammy for customers.

What happened, and how can customers make sure that their savings are still working hard for them? NAB reduced the maximum interest rate on its Reward Saver account by 0.05 per cent, bringing it down to 4.35 per cent. According to financial comparison platform Canstar, banks like ING and Rabobank have also been trimming their rates, with some slashing even more than the Reserve Bank of Australia's (RBA) own cash rate cuts.

• For those who prefer the certainty of a fixed rate, term deposits have also been an option. However, more than 50 banks have cut at least one term deposit rate in the past month, including the Big Four major banks.

According to Canstar, term deposit rates are falling even faster than at-call savings rates. With rates on the slide, it's essential to check options when it comes to banks and savings accounts. Term deposit rates are also dropping, with over 50 banks reducing rates in the last month as they anticipate more cash rate cuts.

COOKS CORNER SWEET AND TANGY SALMON WITH BEANS



Ingredients

- •4 salmon fillets fresh or frozen around 150g each
- •1 tablespoon butter
- •2 tablespoons brown sugar
- •2 tablespoons low salt soy sauce
- •2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- •800g fresh green beans, trimmed

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 190°C / 170°C fan forced. Place fillets in a baking pan coated with cooking spray. In a small skillet, melt butter; stir in brown sugar, soy sauce, mustard, oil, pepper and salt. Brush half of the mixture over the salmon.
- 2. Place green beans in a large bowl; drizzle with remaining brown sugar mixture and toss to coat. Arrange green beans around fillets. Roast until fish just begins to flake easily with a fork and green beans are crisp-tender, 14-16 minutes.

QUICK & EASY PIZZA DOUGH.

Ingredients:

1.5 cups self-raising flour (I use plain flour + 3 tsp baking powder)1 cup plain Greek Yoghurt (I use full-fat)Cooking spray or baking paper

Method:

- 1. Mix the flour and yoghurt in a bowl, using a spoon.
- 2. Dust a clean bench top or pastry mat with flour.
- 3. Tip the dough from the bowl onto the bench/pastry mat. Knead the dough until it is rollable and no longer sticky. To make this work, sprinkle over a bit more flour if the dough is sticky or add drops of water if the dough seems dry.
- 4. Roll out the dough to the desired thickness. Rectangular is fine and easier to shape than round. Either oil the tray or line it with baking paper. Lay the flattened dough onto the prepared tray. Top with your favourite pizza toppings. Bake at 230° for about 12-15 minutes. Just keep an eye on it; you might need longer. This meal serves 4.

Apples, custard apple, grapefruit, lemons, limes, mandarins, nashi, oranges, papaya, pineapple, pomelo, rhubarb, tangelo.

Asian greens, avocados, beetroot, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrot, cauliflower, celeriac, celery, fennel, garlic, ginger, horseradish, Jerusalem artichoke, kale, leeks, okra, olives, onions, parsnip, potato, pumpkin, shallot, silverbeet, spinach, swede, sweet potato, turnip.


To all the recent newcomers to our Village community, we bid you a big welcome. Hope you are all settling in and enjoying life here at Redbank Palms.




For any information you may
